Locator Map of Pearson Peninsula Park



Executive Summary

The purpose of this project was to assess community needs and preferences regarding the re-development of Lake Sara's Pearson Peninsula Park. This was a mixed-methods study in which input from stakeholder groups and community members were used to develop an electronic survey (Appendix A) that was disseminated to Lake Sara residents and residents of the greater Effingham area. A total of 163 surveys were returned. Approximately 26% (N=40) of respondents were residents of Lake Sara and the rest (74%; N=114) were residents of the greater Effingham area.

Playground equipment was the most desired facility for youth. Other highly-prioritized facilities for youth were water slides and a splash pad. A disc golf course was highly desired by relatively small constituency of residents. Many other facilities were desired but not as highly prioritized.

A disc golf course for adults was the most desired, highest-prioritized facility. This finding, in combination with the importance placed on a disc golf course for youth, suggests disc golf is one of the most desired, if not *the* most desired, facility. Walking trails and grilling areas were also highly prioritized. Many other less prioritized facilities for adults were also mentioned.

Nature/environmental programs were the most desired type of program, followed by fishing education and teen programs. Respondents also indicated an interest in fitness and wellness programs – including instructional swim lessons – for both adults and youth. The vast majority of respondents indicated they would likely participate in programs offered at Pearson Park.

The top three supported revenue generators were community building rental fees, sponsorships, and donations. Respondents did not support a number of revenue generation strategies, most notably activity center user fees, picnic shelter user fees, and an annual sustainer fund for park maintenance. In general, respondents indicated they would volunteer their time for some revenue generation strategies.


Respondents most highly valued visiting Lake Sara to be away from "the hustle and bustle" of life and its natural beauty. For Pearson Park, they most valued spending time with family and friends. Other important experiences for the park to provide were activities for all ages, swimming opportunities, wildlife and nature viewing, and year-round activities.

Recommendations

In looking at what the community values about Lake Sara and the potential for Pearson Park, it will be important to create a park that offers opportunity for social interaction, community engagement, and intergenerational activities while preserving the park's natural character. Plant selection and activity placement should be carefully considered to emphasize nature, wildlife, and aesthetic beauty.

Recommended facilities include a playground, disc golf course, and water-based play area, such as a splash pad or water slides. Walking trails and grilling areas should also be considered. Areas that can house environmental education programs should be incorporated into the park design. Such programs were highly desired by the community. Lastly, the park should incorporate flexible spaces that can provide opportunities for a range of programs and activities, such as fitness and wellness programs and different types of adult hobby clubs.

Revenue generation should focus on community building rental fees, sponsorships, and donations. User fees for activity centers and picnic shelters should be avoided.



Project Overview

Purpose


The purpose of this project was to assess community (i.e., Lake Sara residents and Effingham area residents) needs and preferences regarding the re-development of Lake Sara's Pearson Peninsula Park. Specific aims of the study were:

- 1. Assess needs, values and recreation preferences among the community stakeholders (e.g., EWA staff, parks committee, Lake Sara Forever Foundation members) to inform the community meeting and survey process.
- 2. Facilitate a community workshop that illuminates community needs, values and preferences for Pearson Park re-development
- 3. Design and implement an electronic survey to examine community needs, values and recreation preferences for Pearson Park re-development.
- 4. Utilize results of the survey, stakeholder focus group, and community meeting to inform the Pearson Park master plan.

Study Procedures

This was a mixed-methods study in which input from stakeholder groups and community members were used to develop an electronic survey that was disseminated to Lake Sara residents and residents of the greater Effingham area. The project team attended a stakeholder meeting to gather information and insights into Lake Sara and Pearson Park. Next, we conducted a focus group with Effingham Water Authority Board members and staff and the Lake Sara Parks and Recreation Volunteer Committee, and facilitated a community workshop for Lake Sara residents. The focus group guide and meeting agenda can be found in Appendix B. The insights from these meetings informed the content of the survey, which was developed and disseminated via Survey Monkey on October 18, 2017. Several reminders were sent out to increase the response rate. The Farnsworth Group project staff also disseminated the link to the survey through social media sites such as Facebook. A total of 163 survey surveys were returned. Approximately 26% (N=40) of respondents are residents of Lake Sara and the rest (74%; N=114) are residents of the greater Effingham area.

The data were cleaned in SPSS and frequencies, measures of central tendency (i.e., means, medians, and standard deviations) were calculated for the survey questions. The open-ended responses were summarized thematically. The following report summarizes the findings from the community needs study.



Study Findings

Facilities

Youth

The respondents were asked to check all the facilities, from a given list, that they would like to have in Pearson Park for youth. Afterward, participants indicated the top four facilities they would prioritize for the park.

Playground equipment is the most desired facility for youth. Over two-thirds (72%) of respondents indicated interest and one-third (34%) of respondents indicated it was one of the top four priorities for youth facilities.

Other highly-prioritized facilities for youth were water slides and a splash pad. These were within the top four priorities for 26% and 25% of respondents, respectively. Both of these facilities were generally desired by 45% of respondents.

Interestingly, a disc golf course was *most* important (first choice) for 21 respondents as a youth facility. However, no respondents listed this as a second, third, or fourth choice facility. This demonstrates this facility is highly desired by relatively small constituency of residents.

Many other facilities were desired but not as highly prioritized. These included – in decreasing order of importance – a nature trail, water inflatables, fishing pier, climbing wall, bike trail, playing courts, wildlife area, star observatory, and beach volleyball area.

For youth, the top five facility selections (not prioritized) were a playground (n=114, 71.7%), nature trail (n=79, 49.7%), disc golf course (n=77, 48.4%), fishing pier (n=76, 47.8%), and splash pad (n=72, 45.3%). Water slides and beach volleyball also had over a 40 percent selection rate. Carousel and tricycle track were the least desired facilities with less than 10 percent selection rate.

Figure 1. Which facilities do you like to have in Pearson Park for Youth (N=159)





Figure 2. Choose top four facilities from the figure 1. list – combined with weight (n=149)

Adults

The respondents were asked to check all the facilities, from a given list, that they would like to have in Pearson Park for adults. Afterward, participants indicated the top four facilities they would prioritize for the park.

A disc golf course for adults was the most desired, highest-prioritized facility. Nearly one-half (48%) of respondents indicated they wanted this facility, and over one-third (38%) indicated it was one of their top four priorities. This finding, in combination with the importance placed on a disc golf course for youth, suggests disc golf is one of the most desired, if not *the* most desired, facility.

Walking trails and grilling areas were also highly prioritized. These facilities were desired by 45% and 50% of respondents and prioritized in the top four facilities by 26% and 20% of respondents, respectively.

Less prioritized facilities included an amphitheater, beach volleyball area, boat parking area, fishing pier, dog park, star observatory, fountain, wildlife area, open space, and bird garden. Each of these were desired by at least 22% of respondents, with the exception of the bird garden, which was desired by 17% of respondents.

For adults, the top five selected facilities (not prioritized) were grilling areas (n=80, 50.3%), a disc golf course (n=77, 48.4%), walking/running trails (n=71, 44.7%), beach volleyball (n=64, 40.3%), and an amphitheater (n=56, 35.2%). Fishing piers, boat parking, wildlife area/natural area, bike trail, miniature golf, and star observatory were also desired with a selection rate greater than 30 percent. Baseball and softball fields, platform tennis courts, and cremation memorial site were the least desired facilities with less than a 10 percent selection rate.




Figure 6. Choose top four facilities from the figure 4. list – each choice (n=149)

Programs

Nature/environmental programs were the most desired type of program. Nearly two-thirds (59%) of respondents indicated they wanted some sort of nature or environmental program. Fishing and social or hobby activities for adults were desired by 49% and 46% of respondents. At least one-third of respondents indicated interest in adult and youth fitness programs, programs specifically for teenagers, and instructional swim lessons. The most prioritized programs were nature/environmental programs (n=50, 40%), fishing education (n=41, 33%) and teen programs (n=25, 20%).

The vast majority (92%) of respondents indicated they would likely (46%) or very likely (46%) participate in programs offered at Pearson Park. Only 8% of respondents indicated they would be *unlikely* or *very unlikely* to participate in such programs.




Figure 7. Which programs should be developed for Pearson Park (N=153)





Figure 9. Choose top four facilities from the figure 7. list – each choice (N=124)

Valued Community Experiences

Over one-half of respondents visiting Lake Sara to be away from "the hustle and bustle" of life (64%) and its natural beauty (58%). Other important experiences for respondents and their families were experiencing Lake Sara's nature and wildlife (45%) and community and social events at Lake Sara (42%).

For Pearson park, respondents placed the most importance on spending time with family and friends (60% indicated this was *very important*). Four other experiences were particularly important for respondents and their families. These included the provision of activities for all ages (44%), swimming (42%), viewing wildlife and nature (41%), and fun activities for all seasons (41%).





Figure 12. What you value in regard to Lake Sara's Pearson Park/Beach experience



Revenue Generation

The top three supported revenue generators were community building rental fees, sponsorships, and donations. Community building rental fees were strongly supported 65% of respondents, and sponsorships and donations were strongly supported by 59% and 52% of respondents, respectively.

Respondents did not support a number of revenue generation strategies. These included activity center user fees (not supported by 38% of respondents), picnic shelter user fees (15%), and an annual sustainer fund for park maintenance (13%).

In general, respondents indicated they would volunteer their time for some revenue generation strategies. Nearly two-thirds (64%) of respondents indicated they would donate or assist with a fundraising campaign. Over one-half (52%) indicated they would pay user fees for renting the Pearson Community Building. The only revenue generation strategy respondents were less willing to support was user fees for an activity center (e.g., basketball, tennis or shuffleboard courts, etc.). Over three-quarters (78%) of respondents indicated they would not volunteer or contribute to implement this fundraising strategy.

Figure 13. Please respond to each idea below in terms of how supportive you would be for each funding strategy





Figure 14. Would you volunteer or contribute in other ways to help implement the fundraising strategy?





Other ideas for what you would value in regard to a Lake Sara's Pearson Park/Beach experience.

- The public should be able to use the sports area and the picnic tables with no charge.
- No one will shoot hoops or play tennis/pickleball if fees associated (unless, indoor courts)
- Rental for picnic shelter seems a bit much. You want people to come and use it.
 Would it be off limits if you don't rent? I don't understand what Annual Sustainer
 fund is. It is a yearly fee for using all the services? Activity fees for using the
 basketball court again seem like something you wouldn't want to do. There has to
 be some free things as the beach is free right now.
- Would generate more use if there weren't fees associated with the activities such as basketball.
- I don't think charging people to use basketball courts or tennis courts or disc golf courses is going to get people out of their houses and into nature. Also fees for clubs wanting to have special events may discourage as many events from taking place.

- Requiring fees for events or use of equipment will be detrimental in trying to draw people in.
- I think the Effingham community would be more than generous to a great park like this but fundraisers especially where there is alcohol served would help. Maybe 5k race walk many other options for fundraisers.
- I do not support fees for outdoor uses like basketball courts or picnic area because then they simply won't ever be used except for large get together or organized events instead of just being used freely like they should be allowed
- Putting a cost or fee associated with some of the items may limit or prevent people from coming to the lake
- Don't want to charge anyone to use the park sports equipment. They won't use it or they won't return.
- I like the idea of it being a more public park place and charging fees for something as relatively basic as a basketball court seems like a deterrent to use for most, in my opinion.
- I'm concerned that there will be a membership fee and i do not believe that is the proper way to gain funds for a park. It will only discourage use and divide communities that should be one community.
- Events that allow alcohol (Beer festival) are better fund raisers
- Would rather see donations and local support for the project than forcing fees upon the users.
- I understand it cost money to build these things and when I mean cost I know it cost A LOT. But growing up around Effingham there is really nothing to do unless you like to get plastered on the weekend or if you like to get high all the time... don't forget the teen pregnancy rate in Effingham either. I know me and my family and friends would love a place to enjoy concerts. Do you remember when Luke Bryan came to town? Pretty sure that went over really well. So I understand cost and fees but it also needs to be able to be affordable for younger kids/adults to enjoy.
- Personally, I would find it difficult to donate funds on a continual basis. However, I
 love the lake and its activities, and would be more than willing to donate
 occasionally.

- Funding strategies that revolve around fees for the users or fundraisers can sometimes get out of hand. Too much financial burden can be put on families that want to actively use the facilities. They can be done but must be kept to a reasonable amount.
- I do not support charging a user fee for activity areas. If you are looking to get people involved with the lake and this area, you cannot put a price on attendance of open area spaces. What do you do w/ those individuals who typically wouldn't have access to the lake due to monetary constraints? You'd be building another area around the lake that would be unattainable for some.
- Concern private business having too close a relationship with a Community resource.
- I like to have free educational options
- You just can't charge people to play basketball or shuffleboard. No one will do that.
- Users should expect to pay for services in this day and age
- Sponsorships would be akin to turning this into a commercial enterprise, which I
 would be against.
- I believe if you require fees for certain 'basic' things such as pavilions and/or basketball and other sports facilities, they will not be utilized.
- Picnics and things can be in the way and disruptive to park goers. They should have to pay to "rent" a public space
- I would want to pay a fee just to play basketball. Renting a facility is a completely different story, but to just use the courts seems a little drastic
- Reservation fees for shelters, but free use if not reserved
- I don't think you should have to pay to play a game of basketball or shuffle board.
 I also don't think you should have to pay to use a picnic table. But I maybe the picnic area is something different than just picnic tables. If it offers something worth paying for than that could be a different story
- I like the idea of paying for specials, but like the idea that the beach is free to go and play with my son.

- People will not use basketball courts if charged
- You want it to be for the enjoyment of the community, but a bunch of "user " fees drive people away from using.
- Until it's clean, I don't allow my kids in the water. What we had as kids was great
- I think having a user fee for sports courts will limit their use to those who can afford the fee -- I believe they should be available to all. That said, if there was a tournament of some sorts on these courts, I'd be fine with a tournament entry fee, part of which would go to park maintenance.
- Picnic pavilion should be an open use area. First come first serve
- I think user fees for the activity center would make it less accessible for families in the community.
- Paying for activities my family and I would not participate in.
- Some sound like taxes that I would not support. Others sound like not likely to generate revenue
- Just keep the prices fair and reasonable for all. More people will utilize all it has to offer, if you keep the prices low.
- User fees to reserve building/picnic area use for family reunions etc. allow people
 to plan and provide funds for maintenance. Fees for accessing special
 activities/services the same. EWA and community support through donations and
 sponsorship would be better than a bunch of special events, which minimizes open
 general use on those dates and makes it less pleasant to enjoy the lake, which is
 the intent.
- I feel the ones I chose should be a free service or interest will be low.
- Seems like everything is for sale now. I'd really like to avoid overt commercialization of the property. But the reality is that naming rights are a good way to raise money. I just wish you didn't have to.
- Charging for the use of sport facilities may turn someone away from participation in cardio or activities, and that should not occur.

- Kids should be able to play a pickup game of basketball without having money on them
- I would support a nominal deposit/clean up fee for pavilion areas for family gatherings. If families don't pick up after themselves, keep the deposit.
- I would like to attract more youth with programs that are accessible to them.
- Tennis courts, etc. should be free or may not be used
- · Beach is meant to be for public use with no fee
- I feel nature/educational programs that are unique to the park should be free to encourage participation. Activities that can be found other places in town should have low priority. Why duplicate things? We have enough ball diamonds and basketball courts that don't get used. Kids are inside all the time. Outdoor/nature programs are necessary. This should not be funded by an increase in taxes.
- I don't think there should be a fee to use a tennis court or basketball court etc.
 Maybe a suggested yearly moderate overall family fee would be something to consider instead of a fee each time you want to use any of the courts, etc.

 the park for general use and not limited access due to a fee. If so not likely to be
 utilized, and costly to hire staff to manage and collect.

- This is a great idea to develop something families can enjoy together. As Effingham grows in the industrial world, we also need to think about the families that support and thrive off of this community.
- Would love to see disc golf included in this project.
- If a park is built, my family and I would definitely be there frequently. I believe a disc golf course would bring a variety of people to the area. We recently had a tournament at Community Park, and had an excellent turnout. People came all the way from Champaign and Indiana to participate. I also believe a basketball court in close vicinity of the water would be perfect for this park. When the Rec Center by the mall closes in the summer, a large number of people are always looking for a place to play. The courts at Workman Complex are often too crowded to play a full court game, and the courts at the other parks aren't in the greatest shape. There's at least 50 of us that regularly play pick up basketball at the Rec Center during the winter. Building the basketball court at the lake would be beneficial to so many. Additionally, I believe that placing it near the water would add for a beautiful view while playing. There is a court in Wilmington, North Carolina that is called the River Court, and is in close vicinity of the water. It's a simple basketball court, with lights and a set of small bleachers, and is very close to the river. People from all over have visited to play a game on it. I believe that by building a court near the lake, we would have a similar effect. With the beautiful view of the court overlooking the water, people would love to come visit, just to okay a game of basketball. I can assure you, I would be there almost every night.
